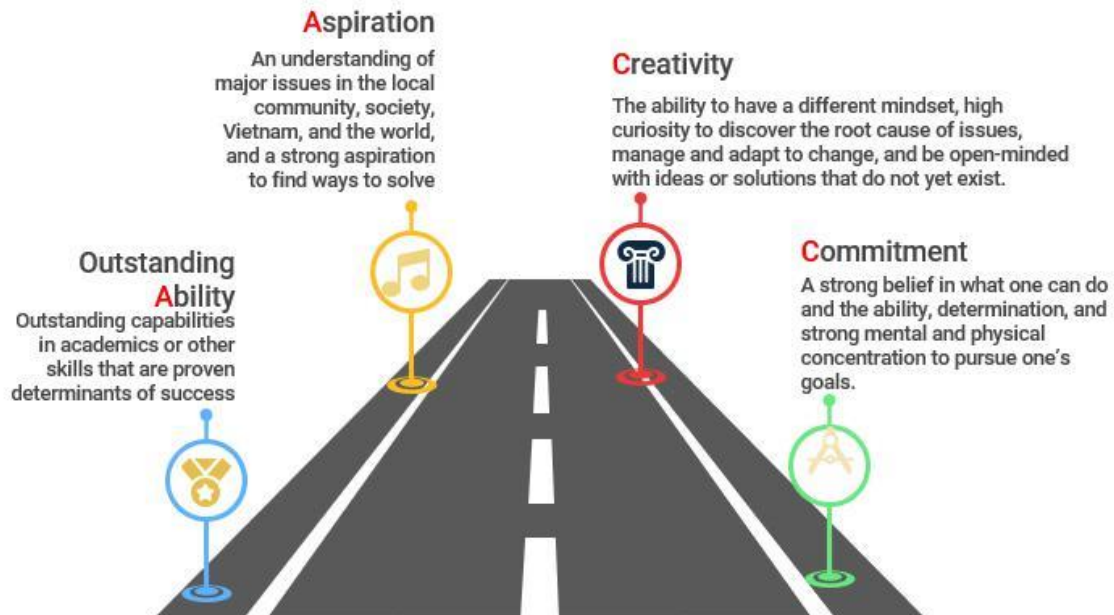
6PM: Come over to the Theater Hall, interacting with the musical club members who prepare a comedy skit for the upcoming New Year event.



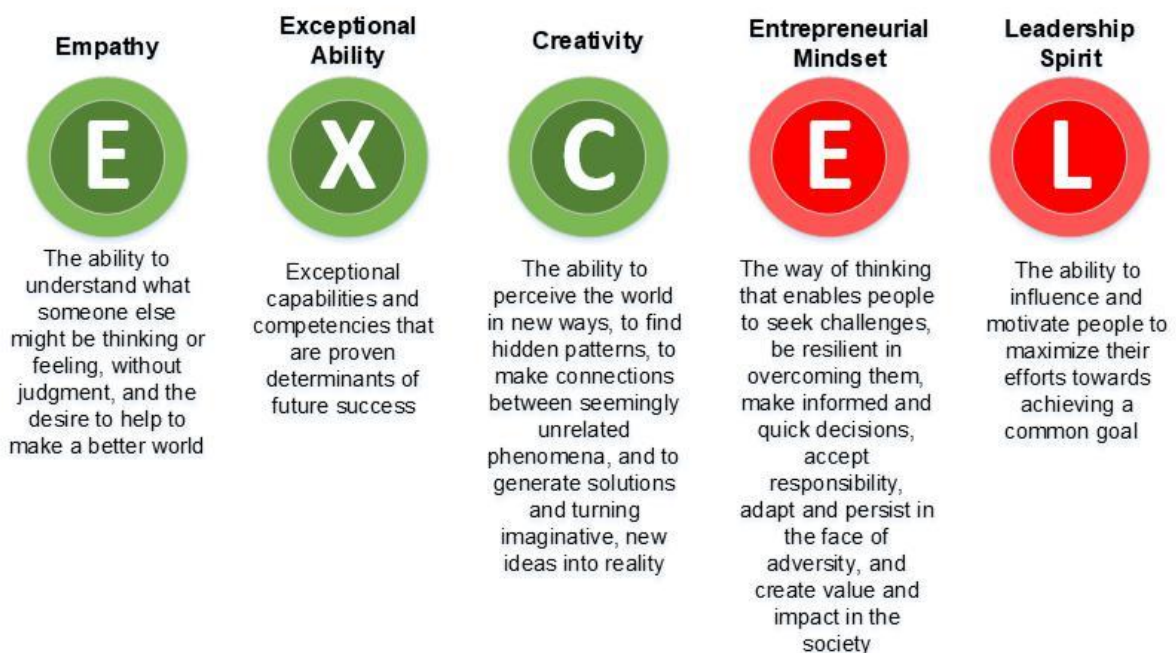

PART 1: MAXIMIZE YOUR ACADEMIC SUCCESS

1. Academic Calendar

The academic year is divided into two main semesters (Fall and Spring Semesters) and followed by a Summer session. Scan the QR code below to check the important dates and the academic calendar for the Academic Year 2022/2023.



****Important Note:*** The University reserves the right to change the calendar when necessary. You will need to take the initiative and responsibility to get updated regularly on the timeline via website and student portal.

2. Academic Resources

2.1. Academic Advising

Academic advising is a student-centered process that allows you to reach your full academic potential and develop professional competency under the guidance of an advisor. It is a shared responsibility between you and your advisor to create a plan for your academic journey. However, you are ultimately responsible to define your academic and career goals and execute your plan to successfully achieve them.

Your Academic Advisor will support you throughout your university life and is assigned based on your major. During your first year at VinUniversity, your advisor will support your transition from high school to university life with your decisions to choose your classes and student organizations to join and navigate the policies and guidelines of VinUniversity. Your Academic Advisor will continue to help you build on the academic, co-curricular, and career goals throughout your university life.

All VinUniversity students are required to meet with their academic advisor at least once per semester in their first academic year. Your first appointment should take place before the end of the add/drop period. We will advise you on how to make an appointment with your advisor. If the advisor permits it, you may also contact your advisor directly through his/her work email.

What are your responsibilities:

- **Initiate contact:** You are expected to initiate your contact with your Academic Advisor for scheduling, course changes, and other matters in a timely fashion. Because of their commitments to teaching, research, and other academic obligations, your academic advisor may not always be available on short notice. You are expected to plan and initiate your contact well in advance of specific deadlines. You should be well prepared for each meeting.

- **Complete your Individual Develop Plan (IDP):** With support from your Advisor, you need complete a goals and objectives document for each year.
- **Keep your advisor informed:** Your Advisor can provide better advice if she/he is kept informed of your academic progress, challenges, and career goals.
- **Communicate effectively:** Good advising can occur only if both you and your Academic Advisor make active efforts to develop it. Fully recognizing that your Advisor has his/her styles and personalities, you should discuss with your Advisor to find the best way to work with each other.

What to expect from your academic advisor:

- **Advice:** You should use your academic advisor as a resource for planning your academic program, identifying academic and career goals, and obtaining general advice on graduate degrees and careers.
- **Assistance and Referrals:** Academic advisor may provide you with general information about and referrals to special programs such as internships, study abroad, and concurrent degrees. S/he may also help you obtain tutoring services or receive transfer/advanced placement credit, as appropriate.
- **Availability:** You can expect to have ready access to your academic advisor since most academic advisors set aside several hours each week for advising and allow you to make appointments outside those hours if necessary.

- **Collaboration space:** Fully equipped, closed discussion rooms, open discussion booths, comfortable seating lounge, etc. on both floors are areas where library patrons work with one another in various group configurations to optimize their activity effectiveness. Reservation is required for the usage of closed discussion rooms in advance.
- **Sanctuary space:** Focused seats around the bookshelves on the 2nd floor are for the individuals who need a suitable quiet space for thinking, reflecting, and creating.
- **Interaction space** is for users to employ new technology, seek assistance from librarians or internal/external professional experts, and consult resources provided by the library. The library offers 2 instructional classes on the 1st floor, 2 reference service desks, 1 consultation room with an English language lab, book consulting space around bookshelves, maker innovation space, studios, teleconference rooms, PC lab with high-end computers and adaptive software. The 24/7 learning common space/room on the first floor facilitates overnight projects and studies.
- **Community space:** VinUniversity students can participate in regular activities such as talks, presentations, book discussions, exhibitions, poetry reading, etc. in the open amphitheater, and closed training rooms with a movable partition to fulfill the needs for a sense of belonging to a larger community.

Students can have access to books, journals, online databases, and more in all academic areas on-campus and even off-campus. The Library provides diverse information services to facilitate students' success in learning. More details are available on the library website:

2.2. Learning Management System

VinUniversity uses Canvas, a Learning Management System (LMS), which is a web-based software application that is used for all the VinUni for credit courses and many non-credit, informal learning opportunities as well. Canvas is used by instructors to maintain course content, schedule course events, communicate with students in the course, assign activities, assignments and quizzes, assess participation and maintain the course grades. Students are expected to login to Canvas each day to keep track of their course activities and requirements.

Canvas has many interactive features such as threaded discussions, video conferencing, Group collaborative space, and many more.

All students are expected to well verse in using Canvas before the start of the semester. To do this, all students must complete the online course **Passport to Canvas**. We advise you to spend

some time learning about the necessary and cool features of Canvas- we are sure that it will make your learning experience a little easier and interesting.

We encourage you to download the Canvas app on your mobile device.



3. Academic Requirements

3.1. Academic Requirements for Graduation

Responsibility for Meeting Degree Requirements

As you would have expected, indeed it is you that is responsible for understanding the degree requirements for your major and for planning your courses of study accordingly. Your Academic Advisor shall answer your questions and advise you with your fulfillment of degree requirements. S/he will assist you in your course selection but will not be responsible for ensuring that the courses selected will meet your degree requirements. Be well prepared to take that responsibility.

Academic requirements to earn a bachelor's degree

Every undergraduate student needs to fulfill the following academic requirements:

- Complete a minimum credit requirement for the program of study.
- Complete the requirements of the General Education and English proficiency.
- Complete the requirements for your major, defined by each College.
- Clear any "I – Incomplete" marks from your record.
- Earn a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.00/4.00 (for all courses within your degree program).

You can find other requirements in the University Academic Regulations governing undergraduate studies. In consultation with your academic advisor, you will create an academic plan on the Student Portal: <https://sis.vinuni.edu.vn/> which reflects your particular interests and needs on top of requirements and expectations held in common for every undergraduate.

3.2. Time to Degree

You may wonder how long it can take to graduate from VinUniversity. The table below shows the standard and maximum time allowed to complete each program, which includes the time taken as a leave of absence:

3.3. The General Education Requirements

3.3.1. Overview

At VinUniversity, the General Education Program (GenED), as an integral component of the undergraduate curriculum, is designed to nurture you in developing sound and solid values to bolster your professional aspiration and dedication to excellence. Therefore, all students regardless of their major discipline of study must meet the minimum credit requirements for General Education.

3.3.2 Program description

3.3.4. Specific requirements

VCOR1010A/B – First Year Experience (FYE) – OASIS

OASIS – an acronym of Orientation, Advising, Skills, Identity & Diversify, Service Learning – is a mandatory, 3-credit bearing course of the General Education Program.

It is offered through the students' residential colleges/dormitories, in collaboration with the General Education Program Committee. FYE is a foundational course aimed to equip the first-year students with a proper understanding of the general nature, value, and requirement of university education. It is designed to assist students to successfully navigate through their new experience

of university learning. It also forms a solid basis of support from which students may further develop their personal and professional excellence in the university. The Service-Learning component, while being integrated into OASIS could create a unique experiential learning component that integrates students' academic study with the meaningful community service: Students will go outside the classrooms and serve the community by applying their professional knowledge to different stakeholders.

National Defense Education (165 hours)

National Defense Education, under the Ministry of Education and Training (MOET) framework, plays a crucial role in building national pride, perseverance, and physical endurance among learners to secure the country's civil defense system. By challenging yourselves with early morning rituals, followed by rigid mental and physical requirements as well as schedules, students develop their self-discipline, grit and durability. Various extracurricular activities are integrated into the curriculum to foster inclusivity, maturity and responsibility towards student families and their societies.

National Defense Education is required for all students of Vietnamese nationality and it is under CAS coordination and management.

VCOR1021/22 – Healthy Lifestyle 1, 2

“Healthy Lifestyle” is a mandatory and non-credit bearing GenED course that provides students with the essential knowledge, skills, and practicum lessons (exercise/sports classes) to make better choices during their daily routines to build a healthy lifestyle. Students will have a greater understanding of fitness, exercises, nutrition and diets to achieve their physical goals and desired health results. As a healthy lifestyle includes external/internal physical wellbeing, mental, social, and spiritual health, students receive mentorship that guides and shapes their perspectives about the importance of having a well-balanced life. Finally, the course emphasizes the practical application of learned concepts to integrate the subject matter into student daily routines.

English Requirements

English is the primary language for courses and communication at VinUniversity. To ensure that you can fully participate in VinUniversity courses and co-curricular activities, which are all conducted in English, the University requires that you have a minimum English competency level, equivalent to IELTS 6.5 (and that each component skill scores a minimum of 6.0).

If you have not reached the required English competency at the time of enrollment, you are required to take English Pathway courses and pass the Pathway Advanced exam. Without the required English competency, you can enroll only in a limited number of courses at VinUniversity in the first year.

Once you meet the required English competency level, VinUniversity offers a required course Fundamentals of Academic Writing to help you improve your English proficiency further and develop fundamental academic skills (e.g. writing, presentation, debate, research, information citation) at a university level.

Humanity, Arts and Social Sciences (HASS)

The HASS requirement reflects VinUniversity's rigorous and creative approach to meet MOET's requirement for courses on ideological education. Courses integrate area studies and adopt an interdisciplinary approach.

Through these courses, you will develop a global and local lens by learning to be critical of Vietnam's past and present. You will understand the agency of individuals in society for social changes. Through grounding discussions based on familiar examples in Vietnam and pertinent examples from the region and the world, the courses will equip you with critical thinking abilities. The courses are also designed based on the principle of content-based language, which seeks to improve your English communication skills with an emphasis on listening, speaking, and reading

abilities, thus contributing to your Competence both in English communication skills and in humanities and social scientific knowledge.

The one-credit course is designed to serve as a reminder for you of the continued relevance of arts and humanities in life, regardless of your chosen professional fields.

LEAD1030- Leadership and Team building Bootcamp

This course is designed as a required course for freshmen to foster the students' leadership development by introducing the basic concepts of leadership and organizational behavior. This course has one big goal for you: to practice and apply concepts and techniques learned in the class and your life to various scenarios. This course is also intended to provide an overview of leadership trends rather than to emphasize every detail and in-depth review of academic studies. Understanding a landscape of leadership will be possible under the structure of four modules: (1) Leader as a decision-maker, (2) Leader as a problem solver, (3) Leader as a designer, and (4) Leader as a game-changer. A leader in this turbulent world is expected to be a final decision-maker to find a creative solution for difficult challenges and will need to organize a group of people with a formal and informal system. Leadership Development offers a safe place for your learning of leadership. Practice, try, fail, and try again! This is the philosophy of this course.

ENTR1020 – Agile Innovation & Entrepreneurship

The purpose of this course is to provide students with a basic understanding of the entrepreneurial and innovation mindset and provide students the opportunity to learn about and develop skills and behaviors correlated with impactful entrepreneurs and innovators. Skills to be developed – through lecturing and in-class discussions, plus coaching on assignments and in-class exercises – include observation of real-world facts, identifying status-quos or problems, identifying core causes leading to status-quos, and to discover original ways to remove causes or to solve problems; networking with people to identify technological contributions, optimizing creativity, seeking feedback, and prototyping or mockup design. The pedagogical outcomes of this course include (i) development of creativity & out-of-the-box thinking, (ii) critical thinking through observation and abstractions, (iii) entrepreneurial mindset and (iv) teamwork on a social or environmental issue. As part of the course all students will engage in a 2-day hackathon to present and discuss optimization of team's solution to a real-world social or environmental problem. The course is intended for a mix of students from various academic disciplines, such as medicine, nursing, engineering, business, real estate, and hospitality. 4. Academic Opportunities

VinUniversity is a vibrant intellectual community of students and faculty. You can find a broad spectrum of academic opportunities that go beyond your specialization. Double degrees, double majors, and interdisciplinary learning allow you to pursue your two areas of interest in a shorter time. While exchange programs provide an international adventure, research and internship help you bridge theoretical knowledge and practical application.

Start sharing your interest with your academic advisor to see how it may fit into your long-term plan!

4.1. Double Degree and Double Major

The Double Degree planned to be offered to enhance interdisciplinary study at VinUniversity and provide a unique opportunity for exceptional students whose interests cross boundaries.

You can earn a double major (related or unrelated to your first) when the two majors lead toward the same degree within the same college. This leads to a single diploma, with both majors noted on the transcript.

Depending on your unique goals and interests, you can pursue two unrelated majors and enroll in two different degrees in the same College or different Colleges. This leads to the award of two different degrees resulting in two diplomas at the time of graduation.

4.2. Interdisciplinary Learning

At VinUniversity, we promote interdisciplinary learning to foster creative and innovative thinking and to prepare students to work effectively in cross-functional teams. Interdisciplinary learning is more than just a class where students of different backgrounds are learning together. Students bring about their unique background/skills to work together on multidisciplinary activities or projects.

How is Interdisciplinary Learning delivered at VinUniversity:

- **Multidisciplinary Courses/Projects:** Courses/projects within courses where students from multiple degree programs work together. It requires either a joint class (i.e. computer science, engineering, and business students), or cross-course projects, or community engagement projects.
- **Interdisciplinary Minors:** A set of minor courses is designed for students of different degree programs to work together. Examples include Robotics, Technopreneur, or Smart Cities.
- **Industry projects:** Experiences designed for small groups of students to work together with an outside company. Individual students could also be immersed in an interdisciplinary group within the company.

4.3. Student Research

Undergraduate students at VinUniversity have opportunities to engage in research with their faculty members. Faculty members post research assistant opportunities on student listservs and research websites. Many of these positions are paid. The university also organizes research workshops for students to learn the fundamentals of conducting research and advance their research skills. 5. Academic Procedures

5.1. Registrar Supporting SharePoint



Registrar SharePoint is a comprehensive and current information source on academic-related procedures, documents, policies, events, and student experiences. Students can see the most recent class schedule, registration policies, registry forms and other necessary information by scanning the QR Code above. The Registrar SharePoint might include, but not be limited to:

- Registration and Academics (Course registration, Academic Regulations, Academic Integrity, Minor Declaration, Program Change, Course exchange, Outbound exchange, etc.)
- Classes, Grades and Evaluation (Courses of instruction, Final examination, Grades, End-of-semester Evaluation, Student Self-evaluation)
- Transcript and Records (Academic transcript, Certifications and Letters, Records Privacy and Access, Personal Information)
- Scheduling Resources (Scheduling policy and procedures, Classroom Inventory, Classroom Rules of Use) Registry Services (Registrar Forms)

5.2. Education Records

The University maintains a record of your academic progress throughout your study time at VinUniversity. This record provides information for academic counseling purposes and serves as the basis for producing grade reports and student transcripts.

5.3. Academic Reports

You can access your grades at the end of each academic semester through the Student Information System at <https://sis.vinuni.edu.vn/>. Course attended, the grades achieved, progression and graduation eligibility, etc. are reported on SIS. This information is confidential and may only be accessed by entering your VinUniversity net ID. The University does not release this information to anyone outside it, except by court order. Within the University, it is available eponymously only to your advisor, your Dean, the Provost, and the instructors of the courses you have registered for, and to the Office of the Registrar for anonymized statistical reporting.

5.4. Co-curricular Record

The Co-curricular Record is separate from the Academic Record, and it lists activities such as participation in student life programs, leadership programs, entrepreneurship programs, and involvement activities that contribute to your student life experience. The Co-curricular Record reflects your non-academic engagement such as career preparation, communication, diversity, global awareness, social responsibility, etc.

The Co-curricular Record supports you in articulating your experience to future employers, job interviews, graduate school application.

5.5. Academic Transcripts

A transcript is a copy of your permanent academic record, duly certified by the Provost, and bearing the embossed seal of VinUniversity. A transcript is privileged information and is available only upon the written or online request by the student. All requests must be submitted by the student or former student. Requests submitted by parents, or any unauthorized parties will not be honored.

Note that a transcript reflects your current status of a record at the time it is issued. You should ensure that any changes to the transcript are recorded before ordering a transcript.

6. Academic Standards and Policies

6.1. Academic Regulations



Academic Regulations (ARs) aim to govern the progress of students through programs of study leading to degrees awarded by the University. The purpose of the ARs is to provide the mechanism by which academic standards for university awards are ensured and the quality of learning, teaching, and assessment is increased. Before beginning your new academic experience at VinUniversity, carefully read the Regulations by scanning the QR Code above.

6.2. Attendance and Examinations

Class Attendance

It is your responsibility to attend all scheduled classes unless your absence has been approved by the instructors of your classes. You should discuss with the instructor the reason for your absence and to find out what make-up work may be required. You are responsible to read each course syllabus and to comply with the policies as stated.

Final Examinations

Final examinations are scheduled by the Office of Registrar and the dates will be published with the registration dates. It is your responsibility to understand the processes and protocols whilst undertaking exams or assessments. If you cannot take an examination at its scheduled time and your absence is deemed eligible, you may take a make-up examination. You are responsible to read each course syllabus and to comply with the policies as stated.

6.3. Leave of Absence

6.3.1. Leave of Absence or Withdrawal

You may encounter circumstances that require you to take time away from the University. In those situations, you can request a leave of absence (LOA) or a Withdrawal.

An LOA or a withdrawal may impact your scholarship, financial aid, or academic progress. As such, you are encouraged to discuss your request with the Academic Advisor, Office of Finance and Accounting, Student Affairs Management Office, and Office of Registrar to understand its impact.

6.3.2. Resumption of Studies after a Leave of Absence

When returning from an LOA, you must complete and submit to your Academic Advisor the Application Form before being permitted to enroll or register for classes. The form must be accompanied by documentation that explains what progress has taken place in your absence that would enable you to be successful upon return.

You will be notified of a final decision by the Office of Registrar.

If you do not return to the academic program immediately after the approved leave, and you do not promptly obtain an extension of your LOA and is not placed on an Involuntary LOA, your student record is made inactive. To return to academic work at a later time, you must formally reapply for admission through the Office of Admissions.

6.4. Academic Integrity

Absolute integrity is expected of every VinUniversity student in all academic undertakings. Integrity entails a firm adherence to a set of values, and the values most essential to an academic community are grounded on the concept of honesty with respect to the intellectual efforts of oneself and others. Academic integrity is expected not only in formal coursework situations but in all University relationships and interactions connected to the educational process, including the use of University resources.

A VinUniversity student's submission of work for academic credit indicates that the work is the student's own. All outside assistance should be acknowledged, and the student's academic position truthfully reported at all times. In addition, VinUniversity students have a right to expect academic integrity from each of their peers.

A. General Responsibilities

1. A student shall in no way misrepresent his or her work.
2. A student shall in no way fraudulently or unfairly advance his or her academic position.
3. A student shall refuse to be a party to another student's failure to maintain academic integrity.
4. A student shall not in any other manner violate the principle of academic

integrity. B. Examples

The following actions are examples of activities that violate the Code of Academic Integrity and subject their actors to proceedings under the Code.

1. Knowingly representing the work of others as one's own.
2. Using, obtaining, or providing unauthorized assistance on examinations, papers, or any other academic work.
3. Fabricating data in support of laboratory or fieldwork.
4. Forging a signature to certify completion of a course assignment or a recommendation to graduate school.
5. Unfairly advancing one's academic position by hoarding or damaging library materials.
6. Misrepresenting one's academic accomplishments.

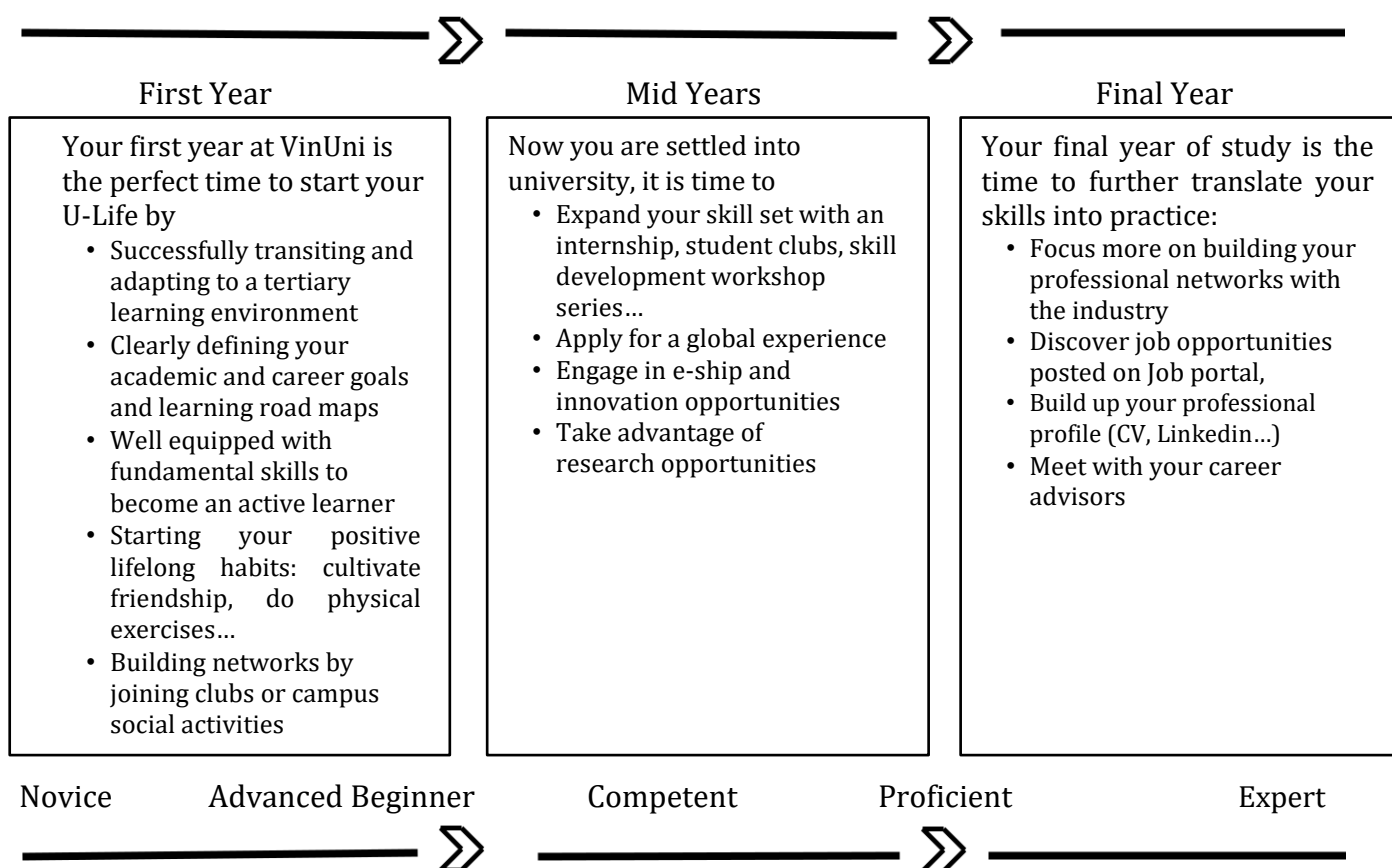

7. Student Organizations

7.1. Student Council

The Student Council (SC) serves as the voice of the students and acts as a conduit for communications between students and the University. SC is a group of elected and volunteer students working within the framework of a constitution or bylaws to provide a means for student expression, and assistance in student affairs and activities, give opportunities for student experience in leadership, and encourage student/faculty/community relations. SC consists of the president, vice president(s), the secretariat, and members who are elected by VinUni students in a transparent and democratic process.

Participation in SC should be more than creating memories that connect you to VinUniversity, it is an opportunity for you to apply academic knowledge to practical circumstances, hone your skill sets, and expand your network. More information on the Student Council will be covered in your Orientation.

7.2. Student Clubs and Societies – Get Connected, Get Involved!

VinUniversity has various student-run clubs, including: Academic and professional clubs, sports and art clubs, and community clubs. Through student clubs, you will have great experiential learning opportunities to improve your competencies, widen your horizon and exposure, and generate high value-added developmental experiences, all in a supportive learning environment. The student clubs will also contribute directly to cultivating your graduate attributes for success: **Empathy, Exceptional Capability, Creativity, Leadership Spirit, and Entrepreneurship Mindset**. We will support all student clubs in terms of financial resources, mentors, protocols, and set-up (with prior approval). We also have other special forms of support to the student club/society if they represent VinUni in a prestigious, national, or international competition/forum/activities.

Sports and exercise are not only beneficial to your health but can also have a positive effect on your study results. As a student at VinUniversity, you have a wide range of sporting activities to choose from.

Yoga, football, dance, swim, gymnastics, or tennis? What type of activities suits you? VinUniversity has a modern and well-equipped Sports Complex Center on campus which enables students to live a campus life rich in physical activity. There are modern facilities for football, running track, basketball, tennis, table tennis, gym, swimming, dance, yoga, and pilates on the campus. All students can benefit from sports activities as part of their university tuition.

You are also encouraged to create or get involved in sports teams/clubs. Convocation Day

With great pleasure and excitement, we celebrate VinUniversity's Inaugural Convocation in the beginning of each academic year with our students and parents, our valued partners, collaborators, colleagues and friends from all around the world. At our campus, all faculty and staff long for this moment and make necessary preparation to welcome students into a very special journey of a lifetime.

Halloween Carnival

Halloween, the most anticipated holiday of October, although originated from Western culture, is starting to migrate and adapted by more and more Eastern countries. This international holiday

will bring together hundreds of students and staff from diverse cultural backgrounds to celebrate the diversity of the VinUni.

There are several Halloween traditions and activities that you might find occurring on VinUni campus: such as party games, dancing to Halloween-themed music, pumpkin carving, decorations, trick or treating, fancy dress, etc.

Teacher's Day

Teacher's Day is a special celebration at our university and in Vietnam. Teacher's Day provides an opportunity for students to show their appreciation and respect for their teachers. Each year, Teacher's Day is celebrated on 20th November. VinUniversity celebrates this occasion with a day of tribute, games, and fun class activities.

Winter/Spring Musical Festival

This is to promote musical projects initiated by the art-loving student community at VinUniversity, where students realize the dream of bringing musical theater closer to the community. Each project will uphold two essential values: Diversity and Inclusion.

Green Sport Day

As part of a series of student-led events, Green Sports Day at VinUni is not just another sports competition day but also aims to improve health and to uphold the sporting spirit. It is an opportunity to improve communication of environmental awareness as well.

Green Sports Day offers a variety of popular sports and games such as badminton, soccer, basketball, table tennis, swimming and running. In addition, other fun-loving sports such as Quidditch, slow cycling, and challenge-the-chess-master are also organized. The meaning part of this event is when the first-prize winner of each competition plants a new tree on the campus ground, contributing to growing more green space at the university.

Career Day

With a consistent emphasis on building a “real learning - real practicing” environment for students, VinUniversity hosts the Career Day featuring guests who are reputable employers in Vietnam and offering opportunities for VinUniversity students to:

- (i) Meet and interact with companies from different fields to learn more about their industries and explore career opportunities;
- (ii) Listen to personal sharing and inspirational stories from the university's leaders, and faculty members about VinUniversity's direction in terms of training real-world talents.

Year-End Party

A pleasant and cozy Year-end Party will take place at the campus to express our gratitude to faculty and friends, to look back and appreciate our efforts and accomplishments, and share new plans for the upcoming year. All students will experience an enjoyable party with delicious food and interesting activities such as singing, dancing, and lucky draw games.

10. Global Exchange Programs

10.1. Outbound Student Exchange Programs

Undergraduate students at VinUniversity can apply for, and participate in, the Outbound Student Exchange Program (OESP) which is a short-term study program to study at a partner university overseas. We are working with leading universities in the world to plan the establishment of exchange study programs for our VinUni students. Current undergraduate students can choose to participate in either of the different exchange forms such as:

Student Exchange on a reciprocal basis

In this arrangement, if one VinUniversity student participates in the exchange semester(s) at the partner university, one student from the partner university will also attend VinUni for an equal duration of time.

Students who are accepted into this exchange program will attend one of VinUni's partner institutions for one or two regular semesters (Fall and/or Spring). The students do not have to pay tuition fees at the host institution. Students will continue to pay tuition fees to VinUni at the same rate as when they study full time at VinUniversity at the time. However, they are responsible for meeting all other costs of the exchange program. Some of these costs include accommodation, airfare, and transportation, health and travel insurance, living costs, visa costs, books, facilities access (if any). Additional financial support may be available at the time of application and will be informed by VinUniversity. The number of exchange slots at each host institution is regulated by the agreement between VinUniversity and that partner university.

Self-arranged exchange program or externally funded exchange program

VinUniversity students who would like to study at a university that does not have an exchange agreement with VinUniversity can choose to personally plan and finance their studies abroad. It will be their responsibility to apply to the university abroad as well as to ensure that all the practical matters are taken care of. Students will apply directly to the institution or apply for an external scholarship/grant program. Most universities accept students directly as "Visiting/Exchange Students" on a fee-paying basis or scholarship basis. In this case, the applications normally do not go through VinUniversity, and admission decisions are made by the host institutions or the external scholarship programs. Before committing to a program, students should carefully research the program and get a full understanding of the Leave of Absence policy or the credit transfer policy at VinUniversity. Students need to get approval in advance from VinUniversity before joining this program. Students can apply for the credit transfer when they return to VinUniversity, and the review adheres to the present protocol and process.

10.2. Integrated Degree Programs

(Based on agreements between VinUni and a partner university)

Students who are accepted into this program will have the opportunity to earn two bachelor's degrees or a bachelor's and a master's degree – one from VinUni and the second degree from a partner university abroad.

The program consists of two phases in which VinUni students will study Phase 1 at VinUni and Phase 2 at a partner university overseas. At the end of both phases, they will get two degrees, one from VinUni and another from the partner university. The modules are often in the form of 3+2, 4+1, 3.5+2 for Bachelor's – Master's programs and 2+2 or 2.5 +1.5 for Bachelor's – Bachelor's programs.

Fast-tracking students take classes towards their Master's while earning their Bachelor's degree, which help them save significant costs of attendance and enable them to graduate up to 12 months sooner. In addition, accelerated degree pathways are intended to build on the momentum students currently have as an undergraduate in an effort to create a seamless progression toward higher degree attainment, in the most efficient and cost-effective manner possible.

VinUniversity is committed to adopting and promoting sustainability in all its campus operations to the extent possible. As part of your dorm life, you will be expected to adopt and comply with the sustainable practices implemented by residential life.

12. Accommodation and Residential Life

12.1. Housing and Support Services

12.1.1. Dorm Rooms

VinUniversity Dorm is located at Vinhomes Ocean Park, Gia Lam, Ha Noi. All first-year students are required to live in VinUni dormitory, co-living, co-working, and co-learning together. We strongly believe that living together allows all you to make social connections, study, learn from one another, and build lasting bonds that will be beneficial throughout your life.

There are two types of rooms available in VinUni dorm for students:

- 8-Bed Rooms (average area of 52 m²) - for undergraduate students
- Double Rooms (average area of 21 m²)

What is included in the room?

- Bed, mattress and mattress protector, pillow
- Desk, chair
- Fridge and microwave (for 8-Bed Rooms)
- Wardrobe and shelving units
- Toilet, bathroom, and sinks
- Air conditioner
- Internet (wi-fi)
- All suites have their own bathrooms.

Access Key: Resident accesses the room using their Student ID card.

12.1.2. Residence Services

Recreation Room and Social Hub

At VinUniversity, you can avail of a comfortable recreation room, perfect for relaxing and chilling out. We are committed to making VinUniversity your home away from home, whether you commute to or reside in campus accommodation. To help this, we provide custom-built areas for you to chill out, relax, and enjoy themselves. These common spaces are not limited to only residents but also serve all university students. The area is located on the ground floor (Level 1) of the dormitory.

Reading Room

Reading Room reinvigorates its legacy as a site of social learning and a center for public intellectual life. It is a cozy, intimate space to linger and study, a gathering spot for meetings, and home to collaborative programs, projects, and conversations.

Canteen and Cafeteria

Dormitory Canteen, Main Building Canteen, and Cafeteria shall serve breakfast and lunch. Only the Dormitory Canteen at Level 1 of the Dormitory Building serves dinner. The meal plan and the cost of the meal plan will be informed by the Canteen service provider.

The cafeteria is located in VinUniversity Campus with drinks and fast food available and is open between 08:00 - 17:00.

You can also find most of the services you need in daily life in your dormitories, such as laundry facility, vending machine, mini-mart, cooking area. The reception at Level 1 is always available in case of any inquiry, assistance, or recommendation needed when staying there.

Looking for a snack? A mini convenience store is available nearby the dormitory which provides thousands of daily-need items. Use VinID Apps, debit/credit card, or cash to make purchases.

12.1.3 Building Services

We maintain various channels to support you during your time at the residence.

Residential Life Office

Residential Life Office is responsible for the overall functioning of VinUniversity's dormitory.

Resident Assistants (RAs) are VinUniversity students who work for the Residential Life Office and provide support and facilitate the resident community. The staff of the Residential Life Office and/or RAs will be around in case of any inquiries, assistance or recommendations needed.

Faculty-in-residence also has an important role in Residential Life. They live in a dorm and share students their living experiences. This is the opportunity to provide a seamless transition between the classroom and the residence hall environment.

Maintenance

Our maintenance team is on duty 24/7 to support you with the issues of technique. You can report the issue through the Residential Life Office or directly to the maintenance hotline for emergencies (please refer to Page 4 of this booklet).

Security

Security staff works on-site 24/7 and they can assist with all aspects of security. Please note that you are also responsible for the security of your accommodation. You should always ensure that you close and lock all doors and windows when leaving the room. Personal belongings should be stored safely and securely.

12.1.4 Care of Residential Property

Room Inspections and Student Charges

Residential Life Office inspects all student rooms and suites at least once during the academic year. Students who damage any part of the suite or its furnishings will be charged the full cost, including labor, repainting, replacing, and repairing of damaged areas and property.

Prohibited items such as cooking appliances, pets, alcohol, space heaters, or weapons will be confiscated and reported. The room will be inspected to ensure compliance with VinUniversity policies and fire regulations.

Students are expected to keep their dorm rooms, their personal spaces, shared and common spaces in their suite, and the common areas in the dorm clean and tidy. Students will be charged with a cleaning fee in case of an excessive mess and dirt.

Collective Responsibility

It is expected that students take responsibility for damages (accidental or deliberate) that they cause to any part of a University building or its furnishings. In cases where individuals do not take responsibility for damages to common areas or private rooms, a shared group-charge will be applied.

12.1.5 Resident Assistant Program

Think about making a difference on campus by being a Resident Assistant (RA)! The RA role plays a vital part in building the community in the residential halls. RAs are student leaders on campus who are trained to create welcoming residential environments on campus through programming, one-to-one resident outreaches, and informative bulletin boards. If you are interested in this program, you must attend an information session to receive an application for the RA position. Information sessions will review requirements for application, roles, and responsibilities of staff members, timeline, important dates, and more.

12.2. Transportation and Parking

Campus Transportation

Within the campus, students are encouraged to walk or cycle between the Dormitory and Main Building or other buildings due to a close proximity. If the student prefers using motorbikes within the campus area, the student must follow the traffic rules according to Student Code of Conduct Policy and Procedure.

If any student needs a special arrangement because of a disability or emergency, an electric vehicle (tuk-tuk) with a driver can be offered to transport the student within the campus area.

Dormitory Parking

Students are allowed to park their vehicles at the Dormitory Parking. Registration for free monthly parking is required. Guests of students can park at the Dormitory Parking area, and parking fee might incur. A visitor card will be issued at the gate for students' guests.

13. Student Health and Well-being

13.1. Medical Services

VinUniversity's onsite medical clinic aims to provide timely, high-quality, accessible, and confidential medical care to our students and staff. Whether you feel unwell or want to seek medical advice, a nurse on-duty is available to help and to answer any questions you might have regarding your health. Students are welcome to use the VinUniversity medical clinic as your primary health care resource for the duration of your time at the university.

13.2. Counseling Services

Everybody needs help at some point in their life. At VinUniversity, we make it straight forward. We want students to have the right support at the right time. Individual counselling service is available to support you in exploring your mental and emotional issues and help you to manage life better. We:

- Provide a safe and inclusive place for students to share their thoughts and feelings with an impartial and attentive listener (who is not personally involved in their life).
- Listen and analyze students' sharing in order to better understand students' thoughts, feelings, and behaviors in order to identify issues that affect students' mental health.
- Discuss with students and work together with them to develop ways to overcome their issues, helping them learn new skills and coping strategies.
- Offer referrals to other professional psychology and/or psychiatry therapy and treatment if appropriate and necessary.

We provide short-term, confidential, and inclusive counselling support for students, for any issues impacting on their studies and life on campus; for example, life challenges, relationships, family, sexuality, depression, anxiety, stress, grief, addiction issues, low self-confidence/self-esteem.

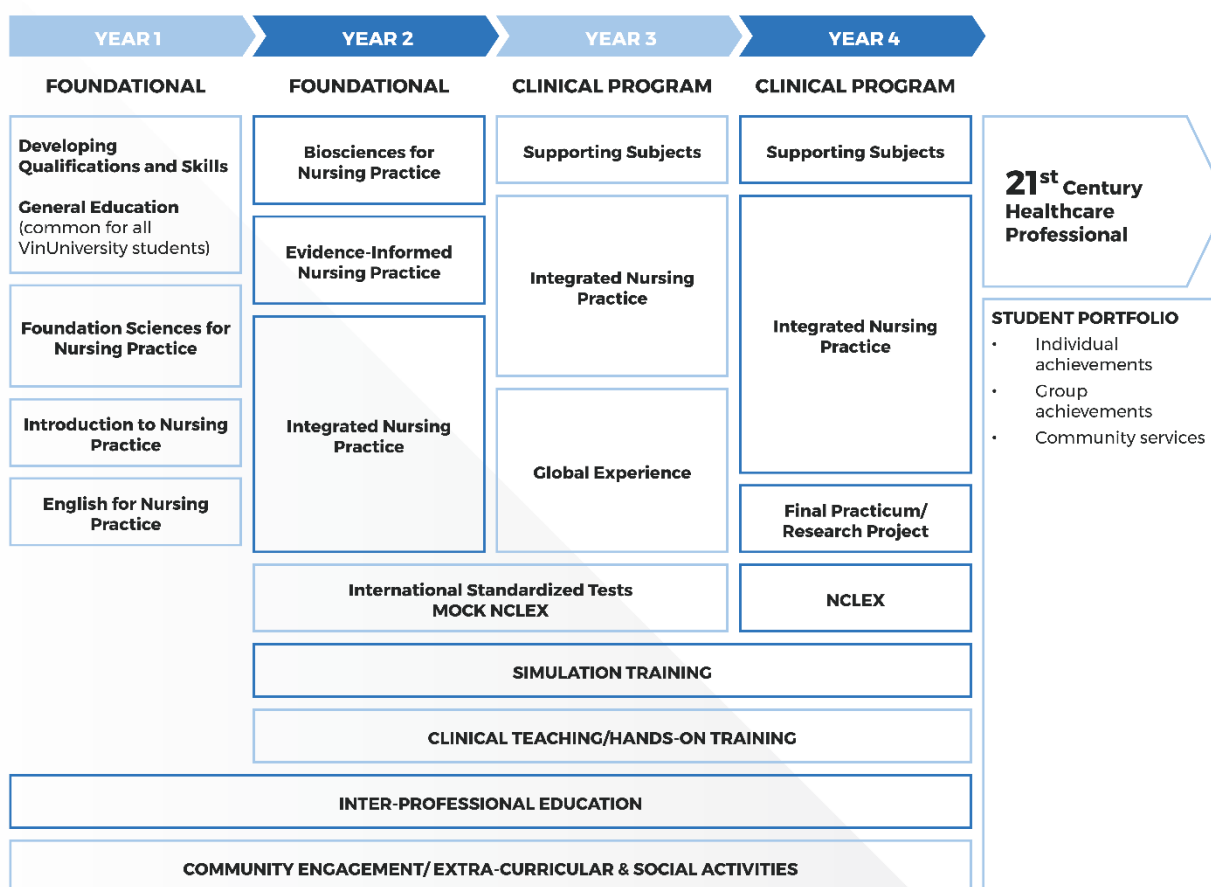

3. Program Requirements

a. Language Requirements

The medium of instruction at VinUniversity is English. However, for CHS students, the clinical placements will be in local healthcare institutions. Students are expected to communicate well and use medical terms in Vietnamese fluently. Therefore, some components of the curriculum will be delivered in Vietnamese, including, but not limited to, the interactions with patients, clinical faculty, and staff. Students, who do not speak Vietnamese, are expected to enhance their Vietnamese proficiency before they start clinical practices.

b. Assessment and Examination

- **Regulations**

The Bachelor of Nursing program's assessment and examination protocols seamlessly align with both VinUni's overarching assessment and examination regulations and the College of Health Sciences' specialized guidelines. This cohesive integration ensures that students pursuing a Nursing degree undergo a standardized evaluation process that maintains consistency across various academic domains. For more information about VinUni general regulations, please refer to [ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS](#).

Regarding College of Health Sciences' specialized guidelines, students of Bachelor of Nursing Program should follow these following regulations:

Attendance:

- All other sessions are mandatory to attend. These include.
 - Workshops
 - Small Groups
 - Laboratory work
 - Clinical Placements
- Where a student miss one of the practice sessions, an equitable assignment will be required to complete as determined by the course coordinator.
- Where a student misses 20% or more practice sessions, the Program Director will be informed for Non-Professional behavior and for further action.

Assignments Submission:

- All written assignments need to be submitted through Learning Management System.

Late Submission:

- If an assignment is submitted after the deadline, it will be considered as a late submission.

Following penalties will be applied in marking the assignment:

Submitted within 24 hours	10% of the total marks allocated to the assignment
2 – 3 days	20% of the total marks allocated to the assignment
After 3 days	An assignment will not be marked and the student receives a mark of zero. Where it is a barrier assessment, student fails the course

Examinations:

- Students who do not attend the final exam without a valid reason and a proper request for postponing the test, shall be considered as having sat the exam once and receive a zero (0) score in the main exam. These students, if permitted by the Board of Examiners or the delegated authority may retake the exam soon after that (if any).
- Students who are absent in the main final exam with a valid reason, with approval by the Program Director and the Registrar, may be allowed a make-up exam. The final exam grade shall be considered as the first-time exam grade.
- A student who is absent in the final exam without a valid reason if allowed to appear in a make-up examination, his/her final exam scores will be scaled back to 50% if the student passes the exam.
- If the student fails, the make-up exam he/she will repeat the course in the following semester/year when the course is offered.
- In the absence of make-up final exam with a valid reason, these students will have to repeat in the following semester/year or sub-semesters (i.e., Summer Session). In which the course will be offered.

Remediation

- All students who fail the final examination in a course will be offered the opportunity to meet the course instructor/teaching assistant and plan remediation within three working days of the results announced.

Auxiliary Assessment

- To be offered within two weeks after the Final Examination in the course.
- A student appearing in the Auxiliary assessment will not be offered a retake if he/she does not pass the auxiliary assessment.

Make-up/Retake Examination

- A make-up final exam will be arranged if a student has;
 - more than two examinations in a 24-hour period
 - earned an F grade in the final exam (if offered by the course instructor) provided the student has passed the other barrier assessments.
- A student who wishes to appear in a make-up exam to improve marks will only be allowed if a make-up examination is offered in that semester.

Special Consideration:

- A student who has faced extraordinary/unforeseen circumstances that could impact academic preparation/performance can request special consideration.
- Student applying for special consideration must write to the Program Director as soon as possible but no later than 3 University working days after the date on which the work for assessment was due or examination held. The Program Director will present the case to the Board of Examiners if a student is at risk of failing the course and the Board of Examiners will decide as to.
 - Extension of assignments
 - Withdrawal or changes to program
 - Changes to the final grade in a course.
 - Make up examination

Progression Rules

- A student will repeat the course/s in the following year if he/she;
 - does not complete all the requirements satisfactorily.
 - fails the professionalism part of the course.
- A student who fails 50% or more courses offered in a semester will not be offered a retake. Instead, the student will be repeating the semester.

Gradings

Each program will mark students' assignments based on the program's grading scheme. Below is the grading scheme applied for Bachelor of Nursing Program:

4. On campus learning facilities and resources

Enrolling in Bachelor of Nursing program, students will have a chance to practice their skills before the actual clinical placement at hospitals. To prepare for this, VinUni has provided facilities

a. VinUni Medical Simulation Center (VMSC/SIM)

The VinUni Medical Simulation Center (VMSC/SIM) was established in July 2017 and aims to enhance the quality of medical practice, patient's safety, and satisfaction through effective simulation in healthcare.

Under the College of Health Sciences, VMSC is located in Buildings F and E of VinUniversity with an area of approximately 4,000 square meters. It has been designed as a simulated hospital environment with state-of-the-art facilities and a wide range of modern simulators and equipment which are always updated to meet the standards of simulation-based training around the world.

Currently, VMSC is providing various training courses to physicians, nurses, other health staff, and students from across the Health System, Medical Universities/schools, and also other personnel in the community.

As a unique authorized International Training Center (ITC) by the American Heart Association (AHA) in Vietnam since May 2018, VMSC has conducted several AHA courses, including Heartsaver (First Aid, CPR and AED), BLS (Basic Life Support), ACLS (Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support) and PALS (Pediatric Advanced Life Support) courses. After completing these courses, trainees will receive AHA certificates with 2-year validity. Beyond the AHA courses, our center also provides a

course in communication skills for medical encounters with standardized patients for health staff and medical students. This course is well-developed by MSR (Israel Center for Medical Simulation) with reality-based medical scenarios, giving trainees a safe learning environment when practicing clinical skills or soft skills in the healthcare setting.

b. Laboratories

The teaching laboratories were established for students to practice basic science courses such as Anatomy, Chemistry, Biology, Biophysics, Biochemistry, etc. Currently, VinUni possesses the following laboratories: Vesalius Lab (for teaching Anatomy), Yersin Lab (for teaching biological sciences), Mendeleev Lab (for teaching Chemistry), and Virtual Lab (for teaching other basic science courses on digital platforms).

- **Vesalius Lab:** The total area is about 200 square meters, with a capacity of 64 students. This lab is equipped with more than 300 modern plastic models, plastinated cadaveric specimens, and a Pirogov table, an interactive anatomy table to teach and learn human anatomy on a three-dimensional and life-size touch display. The lab is also equipped with an advanced audio-visual (AV) system, which the faculty or students can choose to display anything on eight 65" 4K resolution displays from 13 different inputs around the lab.
- **Yersin Lab:** students can use practice biological sciences such as biology, biochemistry, microbiology, etc. The lab has a capacity of 64 students and is also equipped with a modern AV system to enhance the teaching and learning experience. All equipment is research grade to provide students with the understanding and appreciation of how health sciences has been advancing in the lab. Students learn from the most basic protocol, such as lab safety procedures, to the more advanced training, such as ELISA or PCR.
- **Mendeleev Lab:** The main purpose of this lab is to practice Chemistry. This lab consists of two identical Chemistry labs with an individual capacity of 27 students. This lab is always kept clean and well-ventilated, along with strict safety protocols to ensure everyone is safe during the practice. Around the lab are ten chemical fume hoods and modern lab instruments, so a wide variety of experiments can be conducted for students who major in different disciplines, such as health sciences or engineering, to practice.
- **Virtual Lab:** This lab is designed for students to practice basic sciences on digital platforms. This concept's advantages include but are not limited to minimalizing the risks associated with performing lab experiments, maximizing the varieties of experiments students can

conduct, and saving costs while achieving the same learning outcomes as practicing in a traditional laboratory. The lab's layout is similar to a team-based learning room layout, where students are grouped into eight stations of 8 seats to perform experiments on tablets or laptops. All experiments requiring strict safety standards and expensive equipment and materials will be conducted here. Similar to other teaching labs, this lab is equipped with a modern AV system with eight high-resolution displays, but this lab can also automatically video record the teaching sessions for students to re-watch after class.

***Lessons** carried out at Laboratories and SIM Center require students to wear appropriate attire.

White coat (lab coat/laboratory coat) is required for sessions at Laboratories and **scrubs/white coat** are required for sessions at SIM Center.

5. Clinical placements at hospital

Clinical placement is a form of experiencing learning at VinUni, besides simulation practice at SIM. Clinical placement is compulsory and very essential for Nursing students. Here at VinUni, Nursing students will have a chance to perform clinical placement at hospitals with which VinUni has signed Memorandum of Cooperation with.

Regulations on Clinical placements

Clock hour

- Study Hours: Students interning at clinical departments must comply with the university's regulations on internship hours: from 7:30 am to 12:00 pm and/or from 1:30 pm to 5:00 pm, from Monday to Friday every week.
- On-duty Hours:
 - Weekdays: From 6:00 pm to 6:00 am the next day, and have the morning off the next day (or the afternoon off if there are classes at the university, in which case, students should attend classes as usual).
 - Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays: Shift 1 (7:30 am to 6:00 pm); Shift 2 (6:00 pm to 6:00 am the next day).

- Late Arrivals: Students who arrive late or leave early for 30 minutes or more will be considered "absent"; less than 30 minutes will be considered "late". Two late arrivals will be counted as one absence.

Requirements for Clinical Examinations

- Eligible to attend the examination:
 - Complete all learning tasks and achieve a minimum score of 4.95/10 in all course assessment exercises.
 - No violation of disciplinary rules of the university and the hospital during the internship.
- Students are **not** allowed to take clinical examinations if:
 - (1) They have more than 10% justified absences or,
 - (2) have any unexcused absences.

One duty shift is considered equivalent to one class. In the case where a student requests to exceed 10% absences, the student must submit a written request for make-up internship and obtain approval and schedule arrangements from (1) the lecturer responsible for the course, (2) the lecturer responsible for clinical practice, and (3) the nursing staff in charge of patient care. **If the make-up class/shift is not approved or arranged, the student will be considered absent.**

Requirements during Hospital Practice

- Ensure absolute patient safety. All student activities involving patients must be supervised by designated clinical lecturers/nurses.
- Respect professional ethics standards.
- Comply with the regulations of the designated departments at hospital;
- Strictly adhere to hospital infection control regulations, maintain general hygiene order. Limit noise that may affect patients and the department.
- Wear appropriate professional attire as stipulated and have a student ID/name tag while interning.
- During clinical hours, students must be in the assigned position, avoid congregating, standing, or sitting in the corridors.

- Maintain a respectful attitude towards lecturers, healthcare staff, classmates, and foster solidarity in learning. Show care, friendliness, and willingness to help patients and their families.
- Students must complete Hepatitis B vaccination and Covid-19 vaccination as recommended before participating in clinical internships.
- The language of instruction at the clinical practice site is Vietnamese.

Prohibited Behaviors during Hospital Practice

- Taking pictures, photocopying patient records, or taking patient records out of the administrative office are not allowed.
- Patient records are not to be shown to relatives of patients.
- Students are not allowed to share the patient's medical condition to the patient or visitors. If requested, please report to the nursing staff or attending physician.
- Professional attire should not be worn outside the hospital premises.
- Personal images in professional attire should not be used for social and commercial activities that may affect the hospital's and university's reputation (e.g., charity appeals, online sales).
- Taking photos/recording videos revealing the identity of patients without their permission is not allowed. Posting images of patients on media channels and social networks is prohibited.

Handling of Violations

Any violations by students at the internship site during the learning process will be documented and sent to VinUni Registrar Department.

Depending on the severity of the violation, appropriate actions will be taken according to the regulations of VinUni.
